Littleport Grange Care Home, on the outskirts of Cambridge, offers residential dementia, respite, convalescent and palliative care in a semi-rural location. Situated in Littleport, our home is a period residence set within beautiful gardens.

Built by Canon Sparke, and later the home of Thomas Peacock, the home still retains some of its original Victorian features. Our home has been refurbished and modernised to meet the needs of our elderly residents, and we have a very caring team who work hard to make everyone feel at home.

Our home offers a supportive and comfortable environment and we are very proud of our homely and welcoming atmosphere. Our history...

Littleport Grange has a rich and interesting history and was built in 1855 by Canon Sparke of Ely.

It later became the home of Thomas Peacock, the founder of the Hope Brother's shirt factory that became Burberrys. William Cutlack the local brewer, purchased the Grange in 1896 and resided there until 1912, when he offered the house as a gift to the county council for use as a sanitarium but the council declined so the house lay vacant for some years. During the Great War the house was turned into a prisoner of war camp, the prisoners providing cheap labour for the local farms. In 1918 the Grange was purchased by Frederick Hiam who sold it to the National Union of Vehicle Workers in 1920 for use as a convalescent home. During the second war it became part of a R.A.F. hospital then reverted back after the war was over, to a convalescent and holiday home for the Transport and General Workers Union, run by Mr. Kennedy.

In 2012 the house was purchased by Minster Care and an extensive refurbishment and decoration programme commenced. This programme was designed to build on the home's many architectural and design features making it an attractive home with all the modern facilities our residents require.





Your surroundings...

Residents can pursue their hobbies in our communal and quiet lounges where they can watch television, listen to music or perhaps have some reading time.

Outside there are beautiful extensive gardens with large lawns surrounded by trees with a patio area and a memorial Japanese garden. We have bird tables and feeders throughout the grounds, with a wide variety of wild birds living in the garden including blue tits, robins and woodpeckers. There are also pheasants, squirrels and deer seen regularly. Residents are invited to enjoy the fresh air and beautiful grounds all year round and staff are always on hand to assist and escort when required or simply to enjoy the grounds with you. Weather permitting, we all enjoy meals in the garden and there are several key areas with seating and tables. The grounds are used for relaxing, socialising and are great places to invite family and friends when they visit.



Food for thought...

Dining is a social occasion here at Littleport Grange and our dining room is warm and welcoming. The tables are laid with fresh flowers and linen and our menus are on display to show the choices available. Residents are encouraged to eat in the dining room but can choose to eat in their own room if they wish. We encourage family and friends to join us for meals or afternoon tea anytime. We also cater for special celebrations for our residents.

Our menus consist of home-cooked, nutritionally balanced meals prepared in our own kitchen and made from high quality ingredients. Menus are prepared in consultation with our dietitian, with input from our residents, to ensure that cultural and personal preferences are considered, while achieving a balanced nutritious diet. The main meal of the day is lunch, with a lighter meal served in the evening. Snacks, fresh fruit and refreshments are available at all times.

Littleport Grange has a range of beautiful bedrooms with views over the gardens, all of which have en suite facilities.

We can offer accommodation for married couples subject to availability and wheelchair accessible rooms where required. Our bedrooms are tastefully decorated and are furnished with a wardrobe, chest of drawers, bedside table and chair. There is a 24 hour nurse call bell in the bedroom and en suite and all rooms have television and telephone sockets. All our bedrooms have views over the lawns, gardens and mature trees. You can choose to personalise your bedroom with your favourite possessions, furniture and pictures if you wish.



Keeping active...

To ensure residents feel at home we have a wide range of activities to choose from.

We have a full time activities team that organise activities tailored to our residents' preferences and includes arts and crafts, quizzes and live entertainment. All activities are completely optional, but for those who wish to participate a programme is displayed around the home and within our regular newsletter.

What else can we offer?

We have a beauty salon on site with regular hairdresser visits as well as pedicures and manicures. The home is also visited frequently by a qualified chiropodist, optician and dentist and residents can keep their own GP (if local). Regular church services take place at the home.

Newspapers and magazines can be ordered and delivered on request and there is a shop where residents can buy flowers and confectionary.

The perfect location...

We are situated in the village of Littleport with local shops, newsagent, post office, library and leisure community centre.

Nearby is the historic city of Ely, with many small independent shops, gift shops, craft shops, bookshops, antique shops and art galleries. Regular market days change the ambience of the city centre with cookery demonstrations and street entertainers. Special themed markets are also held throughout the year and add to the city centre's vibrancy.


